Goodwill Leadership Today

This 2-hour workshop presents the latest research, data, and trends affecting Goodwill's Donated Goods Retail (DGR) business. It is designed for all Goodwill leaders and features handson activities that support participants in accessing, interpreting, and applying data at both local and national levels.

The sessions draws on recent finding from Goodwill's Competitive Threats Taskforce and is intended to inform and inspire – not evaluate or critique – the DGR operations of member agencies. Participants will work with real case examples and walk away with a set of promising practices and experiments to test within their own organizations.

Leaders are encouraged to bring data from their own Goodwill operations to enrich the session, though this is not required. No participant will be asked – or expected – to share proprietary or sensitive data. Key takeaways will include:

- Understanding key trends impacting the DGR model
- Explore data-driven decision-making in a safe, supportive environment
- Generate actionable ideas to strengthen local DGR performance
